### Complications of Shoulder Arthroscopy Surgery

Hip arthroscopy, or a "hip scope," is a minimally-invasive procedure. The use of an arthroscope means that the procedure is done using 2-3 small incisions rather than a more invasive "open" surgery that would require a much larger incision. These small incisions, or "portals," are used to insert the surgical instruments into the joint.
